Friendly Reminder

It is very important that children are completing their reading challenge every day. In Year 4 the children are responsible for signing their reading record. We would recommend 10-15 minutes of reading each night.

Homework is handed out every Thursday and is due back in the following Tuesday. This gives us a chance to mark their homework ready for Thursday. It is important that the children are completing their homework, it revises what they should already know in maths and English and builds on their skills and confidence in these subject areas. Along with homework, we send home weekly spellings. These do not need to be brought back into school.

Homework club runs on a Thursday. Ask at main reception for a letter if you would like your child to join.

Children will get a spot at the end of each week for completing their homework and their reading challenge. This goes towards the children getting their awards!
