

Prime Area of Learning

Personal, Social and Emotional

- Children are confident to try new activities, and say when they like some activities more than others
- Activities to encourage children to talk about how they and others show feelings
- Children show sensitivity to others needs and feelings and form positive relationships with adults and other children

Prime Area of Learning

Physical Development

- To continue to practise and learn the letters in each family
- Children show increasing control over an object in pushing, patting, throwing, catching or kicking
- Children can talk about ways in which they can keep healthy and safe.

Prime Area of Learning

Communication and Language

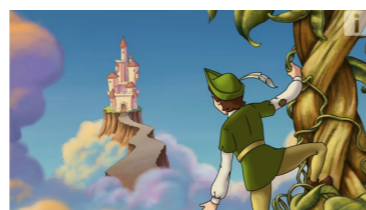
- Tales Toolkit— Children are able to tell a story and use the language “character, setting, problem, solution”
- The children listen to stories— predicting outcomes and responding to stories with relevant comments, questions or actions
- The children follow instructions involving several ideas or actions
- The children express themselves effectively showing awareness of the listeners needs

Specific Area of Learning

Mathematics

- Activities to encourage the children to count reliably from 1 to 20.
- To use a number line to count on and back from a given number
- Practical addition and subtraction
- Use mathematical language to talk about time and size “Jim and the Beanstalk”
- Orders and sequences familiar events
- Use language to talk about capacity
- Use money in role play

Specific Area of Learning

Understanding the World

- The children will be encouraged to notice differences and similarities in relation to places
- The children will make observations of plants and talk about changes they see (Growing a bean, vegetables, flowers)
- They know that other children don't always enjoy the same things and are sensitive to this.
- The children will record their observations using different technology.

Specific Area of Learning

Literacy-Reading and Writing

 - Emergent writing will be encouraged across all areas of learning
