

## Year 1 Newsletter – Autumn 2

### **Welcome**

Welcome to the second term of Year 1! It has been amazing working with your children and meeting you over the first term.

We are finding out about Castles within our Topic this term. We will be learning about the history of castles, their main features and who lived and worked in them.

### **Phonics and Reading**

#### Phonics

Our new Phonics scheme is Little Wandle Phonics and your child is continuing to enjoy a daily phonics session. Each child will continue to receive two books this year: a fully decodable book, that closely matches the phonemes (sounds) that have recently been taught in school, and that has been read in school during reading lessons, and a 'reading for pleasure' book. **READING BOOKS MUST BE SENT IN TO SCHOOL DAILY IN ORDER FOR YOUR CHILD TO COMPLETE THEIR DAILY READING PRACTICE.**

## Writing

The teaching of writing will be based around 'The Princess and the Wizard' by Julia Donaldson



The children will be retelling the story, writing character descriptions, making invitations, looking at rhyming words and writing instructions and a report.

## Science

Teaching unit: Materials and their properties



This module introduces children to a range of basic materials and their properties. They learn to name and identify wood, plastic, metal, glass, rock, brick, water and other materials and that these materials can be made into many different objects. They recognise that the same material can be made into different objects, for example, a metal can, a metal spoon and a metal car. In the second half of the module the children use touch and sight to identify a number of simple properties of materials, and test materials such as paper and fabric to compare their properties.

## Computing

The children will be finding out how to present data in a picture format by using Pictograms.



## Art & Design/Design & Technology

In our Art lessons we will be looking at and recreating Paul Klee's The Sun and Castle by looking at the colour and shapes used.

We will design and make our own castles in Design and Technology sessions, considering what rooms we might need? What defences are you going to add?



## Geography/History

Castles is such a great topic to explore! We will be looking at how castles have evolved over time, what the main features of castles are and where castles are found around the country. The children will be exploring the different jobs that they might have had to do if they worked in a castle - bit of horrid history maybe?



## Music

We will be practising Christmas songs for the KS1 Performance.



## PE

PE will take place on Mondays and Wednesdays outdoors and indoors, so please remember to send your child to school dressed in PE kit on those days. Children may stay in PE kit all day. Long hair to be tied up and no jewellery please. Thank you. Topics taught this term:-
