I have put together some information that I thought would be useful for you to enable you to support your child's education this term.

Phonics and Reading

Phonics

ALL PARENTS ARE INVITED TO READ WITH THEIR CHILD IN Y2 EVERY THURSDAY 8.30AM-8.50AM.

- 1. Your child will continue to receive two types of book:
 - a fully decodable **e-book and a paperback book,** that closely matches the phonemes (sounds) that have recently been taught in school, if your child is still receiving phonics teaching. They will have read this book three times in school prior to the book being allocated
 - a 'reading for pleasure' book to promote a love for reading

<u>Please hear your child read at least three times per week at home. Children who read regularly at home, as</u> well as at school, make the most progress.

2. If your child no longer receives phonics teaching, they will still be allocated an e book from the Big Cat Collins e library, as well as a paper copy of the book. They will read on either purple, white, gold or lime band. After 3 reads, your child may change their book.

PLEASE REMEMBER TO SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL WITH THEIR READING BOOK EVERY DAY

Some children will continue to revise saying a sentence before writing it down and writing sentences using correct punctuation.

They will also learn how to write:

- Instructions •
- Information texts

The teaching of writing will be based around the teaching in our PSHE and Science units.

Maths

This term, your child will revise their mental recall of number bonds within 10 and up to 20.

Through the White Rose Scheme, your child will be learning about:

- **Multiplication and Division**
- Fractions

Teaching unit: Take Care

In this unit, the children will explore how to take care of themselves through healthy eating, good sleeping habits, hygiene and exercise.

Teaching unit: creating media – making music

The children will learn to:

Create music digitally

Design and Technology

Teaching unit: mechanisms

Your child will learn to:

- Explore different mechanisms
- Design, make and evaluate a Ferris wheel

Geography

This term's unit is: The UK - countries and capital cities

The children will explore:

- What can I remember about the UK? •
- What are the characteristics of the United Kingdom?
- What is the same and different about characteristics of the UK and Somalia?



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- What is a city?
- What are the characteristics of London?
- How can I use a grid to give directions?

Music

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Teaching unit: Zootime

Genre: reggae

The children will learn about: instruments used in reggae music such as: keyboard, drums, bass and electric guitar. They will also learn about the features of: reggae, pulse, rhythm, pitch, improvise, compose, perform, audience, melody, dynamics and tempo.

<u>PE</u>

Key Question: How important is it to Christians that Jesus came back to life after His crucifixion?

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Homework Project

At the end of every term, a selection of homework projects will be sent home for

Weekly homework will be sent home every Friday and should be returned to school the following Wednesday at the latest. Again, dojos will be given as a reward for completing homework.

Weekly homework:

- Read school reading book at least x3 weekly. Please record that your child has read in their reading • record, as we collate and record all reads every Friday and award Dojo points. READING BOOKS MUST BE SENT IN TO SCHOOL DAILY IN ORDER FOR YOUR CHILD TO COMPLETE THEIR DAILY READING PRACTICE.
- Spellings linked to phonics or spelling pattern taught during the week. There will be a weekly spelling test linked to spellings sent home. Spelling practice may take place on Spelling Shed.
- Maths linked to concepts taught during the week. In Maths, this may be number bonds or times tables practice.
- Complete times tables practice on Times Table Rockstars

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
