

Year 2 Newsletter – Summer 1 2023

Welcome back

I hope your children all enjoyed their Easter break. This term I will be continuing to focus on providing interventions for pupils with gaps in their knowledge and understanding in Maths, Reading and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling in preparation for their End of Key Stage One SATs. <u>PLEASE ENSURE YOUR CHILD</u> <u>ATTENDS SCHOOL DURING THIS IMPORTANT PERIOD.</u>

Please support your child by ensuring that they complete their homework fully (spellings, maths and reading at least x3 weekly), ready to hand in their homework on time every Wednesday morning. Please ensure that your child comes to school every day with their reading books. Thank you.

I have put together some information that I thought would be useful for you to enable you to support your child's education this term.

Phonics and Reading

Phonics

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All parents are invited to read with their child in y2 every Thursday 8.30am-8.50am.

- 1. Your child will continue to receive two types of book:
 - a fully decodable **e-book and a paperback book,** that closely matches the phonemes (sounds) that have recently been taught in school, if your child is still receiving phonics teaching. They will have read this book three times in school prior to the book being allocated
 - a 'reading for pleasure' book to promote a love for reading
- <u>Please hear your child read at least three times per week at home. Children who read regularly at home, as</u> well as at school, make the most progress.
- 2. If your child no longer receives phonics teaching, they will still be allocated an e book from the Big Cat Collins e library, as well as a paper copy of the book. They will read on either purple, white, gold or lime band. After 3 reads, your child may change their book.

PLEASE REMEMBER TO SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL WITH THEIR READING BOOK EVERY DAY

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Some children will continue to revise saying a sentence before writing it down and writing sentences using correct punctuation.

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They will also learn how to write:

- Stories
- Letters .
- Non-chronological reports

The teaching of writing will be based around the books: Jim and the Beanstalk, The Ginormous Beanstalk and Wildflowers.

Maths

This term, your child will revise their mental recall of number bonds within 10 and up to 20, and their multiplication and division facts for 2, 10 and 5.

Through the White Rose Scheme, your child will be learning about:

- Fractions
- Time

<u>Science</u>

Teaching unit: Plants (The Apprentice Gardener)

In this unit, the children will explore: plant life cycles, germination, and the best conditions for growing a plant.

Computing

Teaching unit: coding

The children will learn to:

• Create a program using an algorithm and debugging.

Art and Design

Teaching unit: painting and mixed media: life in colour

Your child will learn to:

Develop their knowledge of colour mixing, use paint to explore texture and pattern and compose a collage

Geography

This term's unit is: rainforests

The children will explore:

- The equator
- The climate of a rainforest



















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Teaching unit: Friendship

Genre: pop and soul

The children will learn about: instruments used in pop and soul music such as: keyboard, drums, bass and electric guitar. They will also learn about the features of: pop and soul music, pulse, rhythm, pitch, improvise, compose, perform, audience, melody, dynamics and tempo.

Homework Project

At the end of every term, a selection of homework projects will be sent home for your child to complete. They may select any of the projects set. Projects will be linked to the learning that will take place in the following term. 5 dojos will be presented on completion of a project.

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
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Weekly homework will be sent home every Friday and should be returned to school the following Wednesday at the latest. Again, dojos will be given as a reward for completing homework.

Weekly homework:

- Read school reading book at least x3 weekly. Please record that your child has read in their reading record, as we collate and record all reads every Friday and award Dojo points.
 READING BOOKS MUST BE SENT IN TO SCHOOL <u>DAILY</u> IN ORDER FOR YOUR CHILD TO COMPLETE THEIR DAILY READING PRACTICE.
- Spellings linked to phonics or spelling pattern taught during the week. There will be a weekly spelling test linked to spellings sent home. Spelling practice may take place on Spelling Shed.
- Maths linked to concepts taught during the week. In Maths, this may be number bonds or times tables practice.
- Complete times tables practice on Times Table Rockstars

The children will receive 'Dojo Points' as reward for good behaviour, work and attitude. Points can be 'spent' on prizes periodically.
