Going forward, I will be focussing particularly on improving your child's fluency in reading, therefore, please could you support me with this by hearing your child read at home at least three times per week and record tis in their reading records. Please ensure that your child comes to school every day with their reading books. Thank you.

Phonics and Reading



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All parents are invited to read with their child in Y2 every Thursday 8.30am-8.50am.

- 1. Your child will continue to receive two types of book:
 - a fully decodable **e-book and a paperback book,** that closely matches the phonemes (sounds) that have recently been taught in school, if your child is still receiving phonics teaching. They will have read this book three times in school prior to the book being allocated
 - a 'reading for pleasure' book to promote a love for reading

<u>Please hear your child read at least three times per week at home. Children who read regularly at home, as well as at school, make the most progress.</u>

2. If your child no longer receives phonics teaching, they will still be allocated an e book from the Big Cat Collins e library, as well as a paper copy of the book. They will read on either purple, white, gold or lime band. After 3 reads, your child may change their book.

PLEASE REMEMBER TO SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL WITH THEIR READING BOOK EVERY DAY.

Writing

This term, the children will revise how to write:

- Poetry
- Information texts
- Instructions



Reading

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The teaching of writing will be based around our topic for science, which is astronomy.

Maths

This term, your child will revise their mental recall of number bonds within 10 and up to 20, and their multiplication and division facts for 2, 10 and 5. They will also revise number: place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division and fractions.

Through the White Rose Scheme, your child will be learning about:

- Time
- Statistics
- Position and direction
- Length and height
- Mass, capacity and volume

Science

Teaching unit: Astronomy



In this unit, the children will know:

- there are eight planets in our solar system
- that Earth travels around the Sun
- that the Moon orbits the Earth
- that groups of stars are called constellations
- that scientists, including astronomers, learn from each other to make new discoveries about space

Computing

Teaching unit: creating pictures (Purple Mash)



The children will learn to complete art focusing on:

Impressionism, pointillism, Mondrian art, William Morris patterns, e collage and surrealism.



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Design and Technology

Teaching unit: mechanisms



Your child will learn to:

- look at objects and understand how they move
- explore different design options
- make a moving monster

Geography

This term's unit is: special sense



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As part of this teaching unit, the children will participate in a field trip to Rutland Water.

The children will know:

- what is located on the site of my school
- that maps show us information about a location
- to recognise and locate physical and human features of the local area
- how to use a map to plan a route
- how to identify locations on a globe or world map
- how to draw a simple map

Music

Teaching unit: reflect, rewind and replay



The children will appraise a range of music from different genres.

RE teaching is a 4-step process involving: engagement, investigation, evaluation, and expression.

Homework Project



At the end of every term, a selection of homework projects will be sent home for your child to complete. They may select any of the projects set. Projects will be linked to the learning that will take place in the following term. 5 dojos will be presented on completion of a project.

Weekly homework will be sent home every Friday and should be returned to school the following Wednesday at the latest. Again, dojos will be given as a reward for completing homework.

Weekly homework:

- Read school reading book at least x3 weekly. Please record that your child has read in their reading record, as we collate and record all reads every Friday and award Dojo points.
 - READING BOOKS MUST BE SENT IN TO SCHOOL <u>DAILY</u> IN ORDER FOR YOUR CHILD TO COMPLETE THEIR DAILY READING PRACTICE.
- Spellings linked to phonics or spelling pattern taught during the week. There will be a weekly spelling test linked to spellings sent home. Spelling practice may take place on Spelling Shed.
- Maths linked to concepts taught during the week. In Maths, this may be number bonds or times tables practice.
- Complete times tables practice on Times Table Rockstars
