Flute and Clarinet Tuition at Hazel Leys Academy

Our school is happy to be able to offer your child the opportunity to take part in the following music lessons

✓ Woodwind (clarinet or flute)

The lessons are taught by the Northamptonshire Music and Performing Arts Trust (NMPAT) teachers, who will come into school throughout the year and deliver a total of 33 lessons.

Research has found that playing a musical instrument or singing is the equivalent of a full body workout for the brain.

Parents have found that learning to play an instrument or sing can help **grow** confidence.

Students have found it is fun!

Learning an instrument can support the development of literacy, numeracy and listening skills, as well as the skill of teamwork. The children learn mutual support and build a sense of co-operation within their learning groups.

Instruments for the lessons can usually be provided to beginners free of charge with the exception of guitar, drums and keyboard. Advice on purchasing the correct instrument is available if requested.

The charge for tuition is £52.00 per 11 week term.

Payments should be made through ParentPay. Please can we ask that payment and permission forms are handed in no later that Friday 22nd September 2023. Should you have any questions, please speak to the school office or class teacher.
