

Year 6 Newsletter – Autumn 2

Welcome

Welcome back to Autumn Term 2 - we hope you have had a lovely half term break. This term we will be very busy in class with our new learning and have a fabulous trip to Hazard Alley to look forward to.

As a reminder, children should be reading at least 3 times a week at home. Reading Records are checked every Monday morning in Year 6 and pupils will only change their books if there is evidence that they have read. Pupils in Year 6 are allowed to make their own comments in their Reading Record; however, the comments should be purposeful, detailing what they have read in 2/3 short sentences.

Every week, your child is given a new assignment on Spelling Shed. This is to support with their weekly spellings. Children can access this through a smart device, such as a phone or a tablet. Your child's teacher will monitor weekly assignments, as this will help with identifying who may need extra support with spelling. As well as spelling, children will be set weekly challenges to complete on Times Tables Rock Stars, which will be part of your child's weekly homework.

Spelling and Reading

This term, we will test our spellings on a **Monday** and new spellings will be sent home on **Tuesdays**. We will be reading a wide variety of texts, continuing to work on skills such as inference and explanation, finding evidence in the text to support our arguments.



Writing

Fiction: Narrative – Character point of view

Non-fiction: Non-Chronological Report

In English this term we will be writing using our class text from last half term, Pig Heart Boy, to write a narrative from a different character's point of view. We will also be using our knowledge gained in our geography lessons last half term to write a non-chronological report comparing life in the Arctic and Antarctic circles. Finally, we will be writing an essay based on our history topic, World War I.



Maths

In Maths, we will be learning about fractions: how to find equivalent fractions; ordering and comparing fractions; simplifying fractions; adding and subtracting; multiplying and dividing fractions, as well as finding fractions of amounts. We will then move on to consolidating any maths knowledge.



Science

Our Science topic this term is classifying living things. We will look at classifying organisms, plant and animal cells, taxonomy and classifying vertebrates and invertebrates.



Art & Design

In Art, pupils will be building on their knowledge from the previous term, focusing on the linear perspective of artwork and Michelangelo's famous sculptures. Pupils will be learning how to sculpt by carving, casting and modelling clay.



Geography/History

In History, pupils will be learning about the Suffragettes. In this unit, we will look democracy in the 19th century and how this led to The National Union of Women's Suffragettes, including the famous Emmeline Pankhurst.



In Geography, pupils will be learning about British Geographical Issues, such as air pollution, climate change and waste and the effects this has on our world.

Music

In Music, pupils will be learning to develop ensemble skills. During this unit, pupils will use dynamics expression and read a notated instrumental part. Children will learn different vocabulary such as 'crescendo' and 'decrescendo'.



PE

In PE, pupils will be learning Gymnastics indoors and Tennis outdoors. Pupils will learn the skills of both gymnastics and tennis, such as movements and ball control and specific tennis skills, such as hitting the ball using a forehand and backhand.



Please ensure your child wears sensible clothing for PE.

PSHE

In PHSE, we will be focusing on 'Celebrating Differences'. We will be looking at understanding disabilities and power struggles, which will then feed into the question, 'Why bully?'.



RE

In RE, pupils will be looking at the enquiry question, "Do Christian celebrations and traditions help C understand who Jesus was and why he was born?"

Pupils will be explaining how different celebrations remember events which might be in the past or present.



Reminders

As a reminder, our school uniform for Upper Key Stage 2 is a white shirt and school tie with black trousers/skirt and black shoes.

Children are expected to read at home **daily**. Reading records should be brought into school each **Monday** for Dojo points to be awarded. These will be checked by an adult.

Weekly homework will be given out on a Tuesday to be handed in the following Monday. Dojo points will be given for weekly homework. This includes Times Tables Rock Stars and Spelling Shed.
