The package below details the support, resources and opportunities which GAT academies with primary phases will be able to access as part of their on-going commitment to and development of high-quality Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA). Academies will be asked to use £2,200 from their PE and Sport Premium Funding in order to facilitate the provision.

Professional learning support and resources for the development of high quality PE, School Sport & Physical Activity (PESSPA), delivered in partnership with Love PE.

<p>1. Support and training for PE coordinators</p>	<p>PE coordinators have access to the vibrant 'PE Coordinators Network' that provides training, support and professional development opportunities. It also supports PE leads to create professional contacts, share practice, develop new curriculum opportunities and discuss their challenges.</p> <p>The network has a channel as part of the Primary Networks area of Teams where resources are shared in the Files section and the chat function can be used to communicate in between meetings.</p> <p>The network meets three times a year.</p> <p>The agendas for the meeting are determined by the network and Jamie Kilner who facilitates the network and Principals will receive a summary after each meeting. In Feb / Mar a key focus will be Sport Premium spend.</p>

Bespoke Support</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 x 5 hour day of bespoke support per academy • This can be delivered on site or remotely <p>For further information please contact Karen Breen:</p> <p>Email: karen@lovepe.co.uk https://www.lovepe.co.uk/our-services/</p>	<p>Each academy has two days of support or training included in the package. Karen Breen will liaise with you to identify your needs and bespoke the support accordingly. There is flexibility for the training to be delivered to whole school, PE Coordinator, Midday Supervisors or pupils. Additional days can be commissioned (at cost) if academies wish to do so.</p> <p>Popular choices include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supporting new subject leaders • Support with maximising Sport Premium spend and completing relevant paperwork • Supporting the PE Lead and developing targeted support in areas such as: Action planning, developing a PE folder, paired lesson observations for monitoring and quality assurance, writing a bespoke PE policy. • Quality assurance of external providers to ensure high quality and safe practice is being delivered. • Developing staff confidence in the delivery of Gymnastics, Dance, Games, Athletics, Early years PE and Team building and Problem Solving. • Practical sessions on how to move from good to outstanding in PE. • How to assess in PE and practically apply this in lessons. • Demonstration lessons to all age groups with staff observing. • Mentoring and one to one support. • Evidencing the impact of the PE and Sport Premium.





- Meeting the requirements of the National Curriculum.
- Identifying gifted and talented children and how to sustain high quality provision for all.
- How to show progression from Foundation through to Key Stage 2.
- Young Leader Training (Active playgrounds) to develop leadership skills with KS2, MDSAs and whole school physical activity.
- Love PE Active sessions (strategies to ensure maximum levels of activity, vigorous warmups, easy to set up ideas).
- Super Me (active well being linked to PSHE). Extended training for this year includes holistic wellbeing training to include emotional regulation and core physical development skills across KS2 through intervention groups with cross curricular links with PSHE, Geography, Science, numeracy, literacy. This can also be run as staff wellbeing sessions showing how to engage wellbeing activities in a more physical way with children to aid emotional growth and to support whole school initiatives

3. GAT Quality Assurance

- **Sport Premium Website Audit**

- Karen Breen will carry out an audit each GAT academy's Sport Premium section from their website over the summer
- Leaders will be provided with a report detailing areas of strength and areas of development at the beginning of the academic year
- The report should be used to inform the Principal's self-evaluation of the Sport Premium Risk Indicator

Inter Academy Primary Athletics event (Summer term) Braunstone Leisure Centre, Leicester	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The opportunity for pupils to compete in the equivalent to a national competition with over 600 participants. • 20 Year 5/6 pupils per academy. • Pupils enhance their understanding and life experiences by competing and socialising with children from a variety of diverse cultural backgrounds. • Academies throughout the Trust join together to recognise and celebrate the significance of sport.
Special Schools Sporting Calendar	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Competitions/festivals specifically designed to support the development of pupils with SEN. • Opportunity for the pupils to develop their confidence, resilience and communication skills. • Bespoke programme developed each year in discussion with GAT special academies.
Access to GAT Camps	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Access to campsites at GAT academies for a 2 day residential opportunity. Running costs are covered but academies will need to pay for all food, activity etc costs.
