Spelling and Reading

This year we will have our test spelling on a **Friday** and new spellings will be sent home on the same day. In reading we be focusing on fluency and reading for meaning.

Our class text this term will be Malamander by Thomas Taylor



Writing

In English we will be writing a fiction piece based on our class text from last term, Cosmic. We will be writing an additional chapter from a different character's point of view. We will also be writing an essay to discuss what led Britain to building an Empire.



Maths

In maths we will be working on line graphs and timetables, multiplication and division, perimeter and area.



Science

In science we will be looking at materials. We will investigate properties of different materials, solubility, separating mixtures using sieving, filtering and evaporation and looking at reversible and irreversible changes.



Computing

In computing this term we will be creating media using film production. We will look at filming techniques and then plan, film and edit video.



Art & Design

This term we will be studying Islamic art and architecture. We will look at the features of Islamic art and architecture as well as building such as the Alhambra Palace and Taj Mahal.



Geography/History

In geography we will be learning about mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes. We will look at



mountains around the world, focussing on the Alps. We will look at how earthquakes and volcanic eruptions occur and will look at the recent earthquake in Syria and the Islandic volcanic eruptions.

In history we will be studying the early British Empire. We will look at how the Empire developed, global trade, The Mughal Empire and the East India Company, the Seven Years War and what motivated Britain to build an Empire.

Music

This term we will continue to work on our African drumming project.



PE

In PE we will be doing dance and gymnastics. Both lessons will be indoor lessons.



PSHE

In PSHE we will be covering the topic 'Celebrating Differences'. This topic Includes lessons on different cultures, racism, rumours and name calling, types of bullying, asking if money matters and celebrating differences around the world.



RE

This term we will be investigating the question: is the Christmas story true? We will look at different versions of the Christmas story from different perspectives.



Reminders

Children are expected to read at home daily. Reading records should be brought into school each day. Dojo points will be awarded each Monday for the number of times the children have read. New spellings will be loaded onto Spelling Shed each Thursday. Children are expected to log on to spelling shed to play the games each week. Dojo points are give for this.

Homework Project



To complement our geography topic for next term children could make a model or create a drawing of a volcano and annotate its features. They could research a mountain range around the world and complete a written project on this or research a specific earthquake. Or they could research elements of the British Empire, draw maps to show countries that were in the Empire in the past compared to those in the Commonwealth now.



Dojo points will be awarded for Homework Projects – all children are expected to compete one of the projects and bring them into school by **Friday 7th November 2025**. We would love to display them on our shelves in the classroom!
