### Spelling and Reading

This term, we will test our spellings on a **Monday** and new spellings will be sent home on **Tuesdays**.



We will be reading a wide variety of texts, continuing to work on skills such as inference and explanation, finding evidence in the text to support our arguments.

### Writing

In English this term, we will be writing a narrative based on last term's class text 'Letters From the Lighthouse'. Children will also be writing a comparison essay, comparing North America to Africa.



### Maths

In Maths, children will be learning about Geometry – angles, properties of shape and position.

### Science

Our Science topic this term is 'Reproduction'. This unit builds on understanding of how plants and animals reproduce from last year's learning. Pupils will observe a potato, ginger and garlic over the course of this unit to look for growth. Pupils will learn that some plants reproduce asexually, not requiring a male and female, but reproducing by copying itself.



## Art & Design

In Art, pupils will be learning about 'Impressionism and Postimpressionism'.

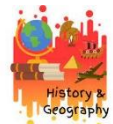
This unit introduces the impressionists through the work of Monet, exploring how they broke from the norm by painting outside (en plein air), using rapid brushwork and painting landscapes showing the transient effects of the weather. By looking at the work of Renoir the children learn how the impressionists used developing scientific knowledge to inform the way they painted.



## Geography/History

In History, we will be following on from our learning of World War Two and learning about The Cold War. This unit will challenge the pupils to consider how the Cold War differed from other wars they have previously studied (such as World War I and World War II). The aftermath of the World War II changed the global balance of power, creating a polarised world led by two competing superpowers: The United States of American (USA) and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR).

In Geography, we will be studying 'Africa'. In this unit, pupils will be introduced to the African continent and will begin by looking at the diversity of the continent, preventing any misconceptions occurring about Africa being a homogenous place. They will build on knowledge studied during The Transatlantic Slave Trade in Year 5, looking further back in time and recognising that scientists believe Africa to be the oldest inhabited continent. Pupils will locate physical geographical features of the continent such as the coastlines, the equator, the Atlas Mountains, Mount Kilimanjaro and the Sahel region. They will know that Africa is rich in minerals and resources.



## Music

In Music, children will be studying 'Rock, Pop and the Influence of the Blues'. Pupils will be taught how to sing and play musically with increasing confidence, develop an understanding of musical composition, organising and manipulating ideas within musical structures, and reproducing sounds from aural memory.



## PE

In PE this term, pupils will be completing circuits and taking part in the competitive game of Tag Rugby on a Wednesday pm and outdoor Athletics taking place on a Friday pm.

**Please ensure your child wears sensible academy clothing for PE.**

## PSHE

In PHSE, we will be learning about 'Relationships', which includes: mental health; love and loss; power and control; being online and using technology responsibly.



## RE

In RE, we will be learning about Humanism, specifically asking, "How do inspirational people impact on how Humanists live today?"



## Reminders

As a reminder, our school uniform for Upper Key Stage 2 is a white shirt and school tie with black trousers/skirt and black shoes.

Children are expected to read at home **daily**. Reading records should be brought into school each **Monday** for Dojo points to be awarded. These will be checked by an adult.

Weekly homework will be given out on a Tuesday to be handed in the following Monday. **Weekly homework will be pages from a SATs revision book. These should be returned to school the following Tuesday to be marked.**

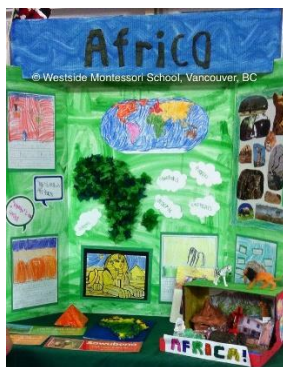
#### History – The Cold War

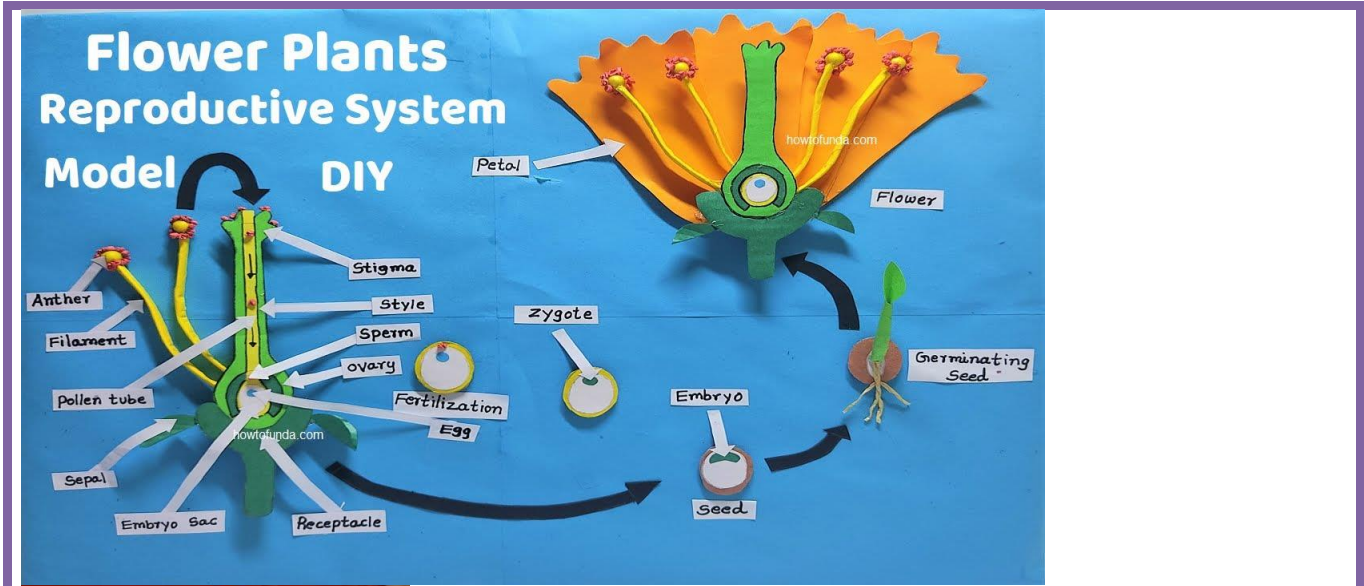
