Spelling and Reading

In reading this term our class text will be The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tullane.

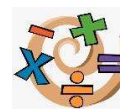
Writing

This term in English, we will be creating our own suspense story based on our whole class reading from last term, Varjak Paw. Later in the term, we will be using our prior learning in Geography to write a persuasive speech about London.



Maths

In maths we will be focusing on position and direction, number sequences (including with Roman numerals) and 3D shape.



Science

Our science topic is electricity. In this unit, children will learn about electrical safety, parts of a circuit and switches. We will also investigate Thomas Edison and his lightbulb invention. Children will discover that new inventions often rely on the research and knowledge of others and that working scientifically can be a long task when it takes many attempts to get something right.



Computing

In Computing children will develop their understanding of repetition in gaming, they will look at the difference between count-controlled and infinite loops, and use their knowledge to modify existing animations and games using repetition. Their final project is to design and create a game which uses repetition, applying stages of programming design throughout.



Art & DT

In our Art lessons we will be looking at Needlework and Embroidery. In DT the children will be making Apple Crumble and Ratatouille for our Booknic that we will be hosting alongside Year 3.



Geography & History

Geography will see us discovering Japan. Children will build knowledge of the weather, geographical features, Japanese architecture and the cultural history of Japan.



In History we will conclude our work on The Stuarts. During this unit, the children will build on last terms learning and explore details of The Great Plague and The Great Fire of London, including the rebuilding of London and Christopher Wren.

MFL

As we progress through the term, we will be learning about the weather, including seasons, the forecast and phrases. We will also embrace the summer and learn how to give opinions about different flavours of ice cream.

Music

This term we will continue with our brass lessons which will end with a concert to all the parents.



PE

Golf and rounders will be our PE focus this term. We will explore different techniques for playing golf and consider safety aspects too. During rounders lessons, we will discover the importance of fast and accurate throwing and catching skills, as well as batting techniques.



PSHE

This term our topic is 'Changing Me'. This will include looking at the personal changes we all experience as we grow up, including puberty and menstruation and how we might feel about these changes. We will also look ahead to our transition to Year 5.



Homework

In Science we will be learning about electricity, including the first light bulb.

I would like you to investigate the history of the lightbulb. When was the very first lightbulb used, how have they developed over time and what is the future of the lightbulb. You could even make a circuit!

In Geography we are going to explore Japan. You could make a fact file, information sheet or an idea of your own all about Japan.
